2nd January

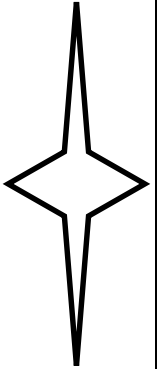
Read about a historical figure from 'The Horrible Histories' series.

29th December

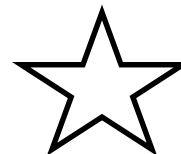
Read an annual.

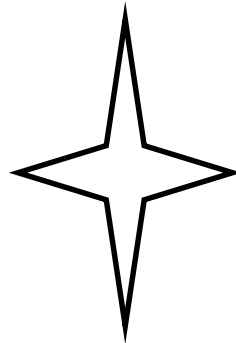
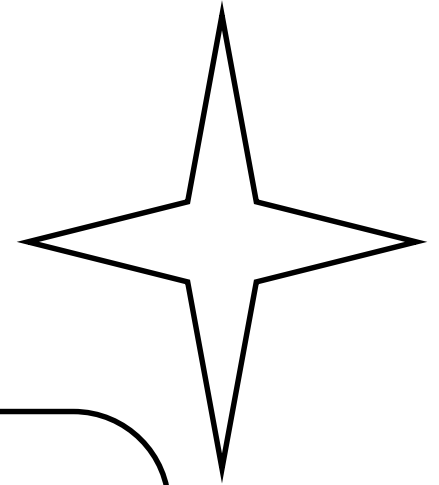
