We will focus on developing a wider vocabulary, by exploring meanings of words in descriptions and poems. We will continue to practice inference skills and justify inferences with evidence from the text. Writing and grammar: We will revise parts of a sentence and begin to explore the use of figurative language such as similes. We will write our own descriptions and poems based on the rainforest.	Plants: We will investigate conditions needed for plants to grow. We will work scientifically - including setting up a fair test; making careful observations and recording results; presenting data using graphs and charts and drawing conclusions. We will recognise parts of plants and classify different foods as either root, stem, leaf, flower, fruit or seed.	Shang Dynasty: We will look at some of the achievements of the earliest civilizations notably The Shang Dynasty of Ancient China.

Rainforests: We will be learning about the rainforest. We will identify where the rainforests are on the world map and discuss what the climate is like? We will be learning about the different layers of the rainforest as well as which plants and animals live there. The children will decide if the rainforests are in danger and what they can we do to help protect the rainforest	Organising Presentations: Children will learn how to familiarise themselves with PowerPoint and the Office Suite. They will learn how to storyboard a presentation to ensure it is effectively planned. How to create a template in order to ensure a presentation is uniform. How to add themes, transitions and animations to improve the fluidity of a slideshow. How to add effective hyperlinks. How to insert audio and video.	Music: Continuing with whole class recorder. To explore more complex rhythms, notes and notation. To introduce and perform 'rounds'. Drama: Developing narrative and storytelling skills. Learning the 5 basic rules of stage. Year 3 & 4 pupils will also be working towards a Spring production. Children will be learning how to read a script, memorise lines, learn songs and develop their acting skills and stage presence.
